Three Great British Authors

ROALD DAHL, 1916–1990

Roald Dahl was born in South Wales, but his parents were Norwegian. He had three sisters and they all spoke Norwegian at home. Dahl didn't enjoy school and he often played tricks on the teachers and got into trouble. When he left school, he travelled to Africa. He then became a pilot in the Second World War. His first stories were about his experiences in the war. He wrote sixteen novels for children, including 'Matilda', 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' and 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. In many of his novels, the children play tricks on the adults. He also wrote strange and scary short stories for adults.



LEWIS CARROLL, 1832–1898

Lewis Carroll's real name was Charles Dodgson. He was born in England and he had ten brothers and sisters. He often made up stories for them. He loved maths at school and later became a university maths teacher. He was very shy with other adults but enjoyed spending time with his friend Henry's three daughters, Alice, Lorina and Edith. On July 4th, 1862, they had a picnic together and Dodgson made up the story of 'Alice's Adventures in Wonderland' for the girls. He published the story three years later, in 1865. In 1871 he wrote a sequel: 'Through the Looking Glass and What Alice Found There'. The books have a lot of strange fantastic creatures in them.



J.K. ROWLING 1965–

J.K. Rowling is one of the most famous authors alive today. She studied French at university and then went to Portugal in 1990 and worked as an English teacher. She got married and had a daughter, Jessica, but her marriage ended and she decided to return to England in 1993. She first thought of the idea of a boy wizard and a school of magic when she was on a train from Manchester to London in 1990. Between 1990 and 1995 she wrote the first Harry Potter book and planned the plots of the other five books. The Harry Potter books were all very successful and there were also eight Harry Potter films. There is now a Harry Potter theme park in Orlando, Florida and a Harry Potter Film Studio tour in London.
